Elizabeth Newcomb Stillwell Classes for Young Ladies

THE QUINCY MUSEUM, 1601 MAINE, will offer its popular Elizabeth Newcomb Stillwell Classes for Young Ladies beginning the week of **June 9**. These exciting and informative classes are intended for girls between the ages of eight and 12.

The week-long classes will focus on the eras represented by each of the popular American Girls series of dolls. June classes are Fun with Molly and Emily, girls who lived during World War II; Fun with Julie and Ivy, girls of the 1970s; and Fun with Kit, a young lady who lived during the Great Depression. Other classes will be offered in July and August.

The classes for 2008 will focus on sewing activities with a sewing project appropriate to each time period each week of the class. Girls will do both hand and machine sewing and will also have the opportunity to cook foods that would have been served during the time period under study. Each week will conclude with a tea party and participants may invite their parents to attend. They will serve treats they have made during the week.

Most classes will be held from 10 a.m.-noon. However, this year there will also be an afternoon session one week in July that will be held from 2-4 p.m. Classes cost \$30 per week for nonmembers and \$25 per week for QM members. The museum is also offering its popular Boy Scout Merit Badge classes in June and July. The classes are held in conjunction with the Mississippi Valley Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
